Children in Care, Care Leavers 14-16 and LLDD

Hartlepool College of Further Education, has a comprehensive transition programme for vulnerable learners which includes those with an Education, Health and Care plan as well as other students with learning difficulties and/or disabilities (LLDD). The transition programme ensures that learners identified have the appropriate support network in place before they start their learning journey at the College.

A dedicated member of the learning support team, SEND & Foundation Studies Officer, and the Progression Coach team (DSOs) are involved in preparations for college life. They monitor transition and enrolment. They work closely with professionals (such as the Local Authority SEND Officers) outside of College and parents/carers to ensure that vulnerable learners are safe and have the correct support in place.

The learning support staff frequently liaise with the DSOs to ensure updated information is shared and that support can be assessed and reviewed as and when necessary.
