

SCHOOL OF HEALTH, CARE AND EDUCATION LEVEL 2 DIPLOMA FOR THE EARLY YEARS PRACTITIONER

TRANSITION PACKAGE

(THIS PACKAGE NEEDS TO BE COMPLETED AND ASSESSED BY THE COURSE TUTOR)

WELCOME

This qualification prepares learners to work with children from birth to five years, with knowledge of children up to 7 years.

You will be required to attend placement for 250 hours during the year to show competence in both knowledge and skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two grade 4's (one must include English and Maths) three grade 3's. You will be enrolled to G.C.S.E English or Maths alongside your main programme of study if this has not been achieved at school. Completion of a DBS check. An interview with the course tutor is compulsory.

PROGRESSION

This qualification allows a learner to count towards the Level 2 ratio as qualified Level 2 Early Years Practitioner within the Early Years Workforce. Learners may work under supervision in a variety of roles such as: nursery practitioner, class assistant, preschool practitioner. Learners are also able to progress onto Level 3 Early Years Educator qualifications and other relevant Level 3 qualifications.

Understand how to support children's development	Support care routines for babies and young children
Support the needs of babies and young children with Special Educational Needs and Disability	Support well-being of babies and young children for healthy lifestyles
Promote play in an Early Years Setting	Support babies and young to be physically active
Partnership working in the Early Years	Promote positive behaviour in Early Years Settings
Support the planning and delivery of activities, purposeful play opportunities and educational programmes	Support the needs of the child in the preparing for school

You could also start looking the subjects that will be taught over the year.


HOW CAN I PREPARE FOR THIS COURSE?
