WHO CAN APPLY?

HOW DO I APPLY?

WHAT WILL HAPPEN?

You will have an interview with the Course Tutor.

If you are successful, you get a start date and time.

WHAT DO I NEED?

You will need a large, lever arch file, a smaller A4 file, A4 lined paper, writing pens, around 20 file dividers and any other stationery items you think you might use (felt tip pens/pencils).

WHEN WILL I BE IN COLLEGE?

You will have a timetable for your main qualification. You will also study Maths and English alongside if you need to achieve a 4+. This could be GCSE or Functional Skills.

HOW LONG ISTHE COURSE?

The course is a year long. There are three parts to the course; the Award (September to December), the Certificate (January to April) and the Diploma (May – June). You will achieve a full diploma at the end of the year.

Enrolment to each element depends on the individual achieving the required units and college behaviour standards.

No, you will complete a portfolio of written assignments and creative tasks.
